From the pastor's desk...

Observing the National Day of Prayer – It Begins with Us!

"I urge, then, first of all, that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone — for kings and all



those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness."
1 Timothy 2:1-2 NIV

Recently a U.S. district court judge in Wisconsin ruled the National Day of Prayer unconstitutional. The decision has been appealed and the President will go ahead and proclaim the National Day of Prayer, in spite of the judge's ruling. Certainly if ever there was a need for national prayer it is now with all that is happening in our world. That said, while officially proclaimed from the White House, the observance of the day is only as real and meaningful as you and I make it. What difference does it make for a day of prayer to be proclaimed if God's people don't pause to participate? Sometimes I know we get discouraged, wondering how, if and when, some prayers will be answered. But the burden of the answer

does not lie with us. In fact, the whole point of prayer is leaving our burdens with God who is able and acts at once in response to our individual prayers and in the fulfillment of his broader purposes and plan. One thing that has stood out to me as we have been going through the Book of Revelation together on Sunday mornings is how God has chosen to weave his direct response to the prayers of his people into the unfolding of his justice and deliverance in the last days. Certainly Jesus' disciples noticed that prayer was central to our Savior's life and it was one day after he finished praying that they asked the question that led to his teaching them the prayer we call the Lord's Prayer. Over and over throughout Scripture, we find God's people calling out to God in prayer and finding him all sufficient in their times of need. That is true for us as well.

To more fully observe the National Day of Prayer here at Zion this year, I would like to invite you to join with me as a part of this church family and participate in a 24 hour prayer challenge. It will only take you 15 minutes and it will work like this: At the church Welcome Center is a

sign up sheet in which the 24 hours of May 6th, 2010 have been divided up into 15 minute blocks. Simply sign up for as many time slots as you will commit to spending in prayer or you may call the church office to ask about available times and have your name signed for the ones you commit to. For some, it will mean praying the first thing when they get up in the morning; for others it will be during a coffee break or lunch hour; for still others it will mean setting your alarm to get up and pray in the wee hours of the night. You may pray at home or at work or wherever you are. The church sanctuary will be open for prayer from 8:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. that day including over the lunch hour. You may pray alone or with others. You may use a prayer guide that we will have available the Sunday before or simply as the Lord leads you. All we ask is that you fulfill as many 15 minute blocks as you sign up for and that you try to do it at the time you have signed up for. Thankfully, God is much more interested in our hearts as we come to him in prayer than in lengths and times of prayer; so if circumstances keep you from praying exactly when you sign up and for exactly so many minutes that's okay too. But let us as least make the effort to come together as a body and truly make this National Day of Prayer a day filled with our praises, confessions, intercessions and thanksgivings to our great and awesome God!

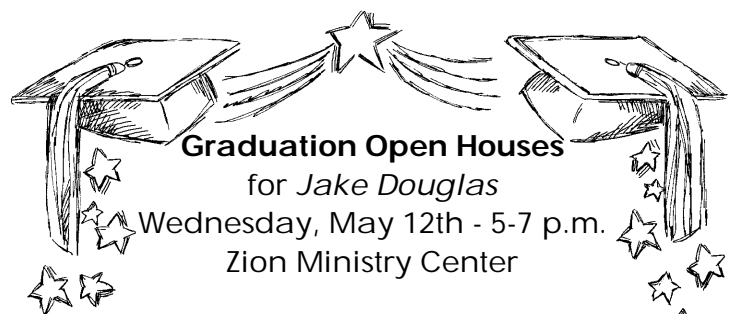
