From the pastor's desk . . .

Hiding God's Word Where You Can Find It Again

*"Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee."
Psalm 119:11 KJV*



I still remember receiving a Gideon Bible as a child. It had everything in it; the New Testament, Psalms and Proverbs, the Gospel, how to receive Christ, John 3:16 in several different languages, some patriotic items like the Pledge of Allegiance, and a whole section of "Helps." That last section, titled, "Where to Find Help When..." had topics and scriptures for many situations – when you can't sleep, when you're worried, when you're angry, when you need guidance, and so on. Over the years, as I have owned different Bibles, I have always appreciated those "Helps," because at times we all need them. As the years rolled by I noticed that certain verses just show up again and again in this "Helps" section, and many of them I have hidden in my heart, by taking a few minutes to memorize them. There was a time when I was a child that I really did not enjoy Scripture memorization. Memorizing Bible verses seemed arbitrary and uninteresting, but again over time, I have learned the value of many of the verses I was asked to memorize as a child in Sunday School and Awana. Off and on in my adult life I have continued to add new Scriptures to my memory, as well as to review old ones. What was once a chore has become a joy. What once seemed a boring exercise has become a help in life's tough spots, nourishment to my soul, and a light by which the

Holy Spirit has given guidance to my path. I do not always have the Scriptures at hand when a difficult situation arises, but I have a few key verses hidden in my heart – right where God's Spirit can call them to mind when I most need them. Some Scriptures I have memorized, reviewed and used so many times, I am confident they are burned into my memory for life. Others, I just take to heart for a time as they are needed. Always the exercise has value, and it is often in the memorizing itself that God most impresses his help and wisdom from the verse upon on my mind, as I recite it a few words at a time, pondering it's meaning in my circumstance. I have also noticed when visiting people in nursing homes, at advanced old age, when people have memory loss through Alzheimer's and dementia and when visiting with people on their death beds, there are certain Scriptures, learned long ago in childhood or confirmation that continue to speak God's truth, and saving hope in their souls. What a beautiful thing when a person has forgotten all else to be able to call to mind God's truth learned decades before! Scripture memory no doubt has physical benefits in terms of keeping ones mind sharp and exercising the memory. It has mental health benefits in terms of speaking God's truth when our thoughts become anxious and unclear. It has social benefits as it let's Scripture speak to our hearts in terms of how we respond to co-workers, family and friends. And of course, there are spiritual benefits, allowing God to comfort and convict, challenge and encourage you to a more

godly life and a closer walk with him.

The best way to do Scripture memorization, I find, is a few words at a time, perhaps as far as a comma, building after repeating a line or phrase several times, by adding the next line or phrase and after repeating that several times, joining the two together. Slowly, in this manner, one can learn a verse, a paragraph, a chapter, even a whole book of the Bible. But the goal is not to achieve a large volume of Scriptures, but passages short or long that are meaningful and helpful to you as you seek to follow the Lord.

So, when was the last time you committed a little Scripture to memory and to prayer? Here are a few of my favorite Scriptures arranged by topic. Perhaps you'd like to begin by memorizing some of these or some other passage that you have often turned to for help in the past.

In closing, I just want to mention that normally my God-things will not be about money. However, at the beginning of the club year we have some large expenses and as I trust God to provide - and remind myself - that **HE IS IN CONTROL**, I experience so many blessings as things similar to the above happen.




