From the pastor's desk . . .

It's Time to Vote...and Pray!

"I urge, then, first of all, that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone - for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness."

1 Timothy 2:1-2 NIV

On Tuesday, November 4th, we Americans will participate in a rare privilege in the history of the world – we will have a part in choosing the new leadership in our country at several levels, from the White House to the courthouse, from Washington to state and local elections. And the choices we make as a people will affect the course of history both at home and around the world for years to come, because the actions of those we place in power will far outlive their individual tenures in office or on a court bench. What an awesome responsibility! What a rare and precious privilege!

As believing Christians, citizens of the kingdom of Heaven yet living here on earth, our opportunity of influence and responsibility to act is even greater. With all other American citizens we have the right and responsibility to vote but as believers we have the still higher privilege and responsibility to pray and petition the throne of heaven, not so much for one candidate over another, but more so for God to sovereignly act for the good of our nation by placing in power a

candidate who humbly fears God and seeks righteousness, mercy and justice for the people of this great land. Sometimes in sarcasm we may be tempted to think of politics in the public sphere to be a very unspiritual affair but nothing could be farther from the truth. To God's people living in a pagan country where they had no political voice Jeremiah the prophet wrote these words:

"Also, seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile.

Pray to the LORD for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper."

Jeremiah 29:7 NIV

Furthermore, God is ultimately the one who puts all rulers in place, even unbelievers, to accomplish his good purposes in the unfolding of history. Consider Isaiah's words about the future king who would release God's people from exile:

*"For the sake of Jacob my servant,
of Israel my chosen,
I summon you by name
and bestow on you a title of honor,
though you do not acknowledge me.
I am the LORD, and there is no other;
apart from me there is no God.*

*I will strengthen you,
though you have not acknowledged me,”
Isaiah 45:4-5 NIV*

Still further on, the prophet speaks of the future ruler by name and specifies what he will do:

*“I will raise up Cyrus in my righteousness:
I will make all his ways straight.
He will rebuild my city
and set my exiles free,
but not for a price or reward,
says the LORD Almighty.”
Isaiah 45:13 NIV*

This is because as it says in Proverbs 21:1,

*“The king's heart is in the hand of the LORD;
he directs it like a watercourse wherever he
pleases.”*

With this in mind and remembering that God alone is the final ruler in all creation over all things, let us come boldly to the throne of grace seeking God's choice for this hour of history. Once elected, whether it be the candidate of your choice or the opponent, let us trust God's choice and pray for that individual who will hold the presidency and the many who will hold lower offices of power as well, remembering Paul's words to Timothy long ago, and making them our own:

*“I urge, then, first of all, that requests, prayers,
intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone—

peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness.
This is good, and pleases God our Savior, who wants all


Two pumpkins, hand painted and donated by Pat Stricker, were won by Cher Maybee and Jerry Ross. Thank you, Pat!




New business: Nonie stated that she will be stepping down at the end of the year as chairman for Group I. Funeral dinners were discussed and was tabled until the next meeting.

BOOK RECOMMENDATION FOR NOVEMBER. . .**What in the World is Going On?
10 Prophetic Clues You Cannot
Afford to Ignore***by David Jeremiah*

Israel, oil, the European Union, Islam; every day the media report on these flashpoint issues, but they almost never put them into the context of the biblical end times. How they relate to each other and how they relate to the last days are more important than isolated stories containing them as elements, but what does the finished puzzle look like? Combining all these with biblical themes of the Rapture, the Antichrist and Armageddon, David Jeremiah singles out ten issues relevant to the end of history as we know it, and he expertly weaves them together to illustrate a framework for the future. Stark in its depiction of upcoming world events and bold in its declaration of salvation of the repentant faithful, *What in the World is Going On?* helps to lift the mystery away from these often difficult to understand parts of prophecy.

YOUTH - At the October council meeting, I reported that I have never enjoyed doing my job more than I have during the first two months of this school year. There are many factors making ministry such a joy at this time. I sincerely love the students I am working with each week, and I feel like I have a great working relationship with their parents. I have organized my schedule to have enough time to study and plan for the five youth events I am involved in each week and still have time to spend with students outside of church. I have enjoyed spending time with students at school related sporting events, music concerts, and at our home in addition to the time I spend with them at church activities. These times provide such good opportunities to show students how the truths we try to teach them each week are to be lived out in the real lives of real people.

There are a couple things I am doing this year that are different from last year. My role in Awana has changed a bit as I am now doing the lesson for our Truth & Training (3rd-6th grade) group every week. So far, I think the kids have responded to the lessons pretty well. It will take a few more months to be able to really evaluate the benefits of having a more consistent lesson time. We have also started meeting with our senior high group for prayer and fellowship on Sunday nights after Awana. This is always an enjoyable time for me as I get the chance to spend some less formal time with these students. These students seem to like spending time together, but it is taking everyone a while to get comfortable sharing and praying in front of the group. Hopefully, as we keep meeting, the students will become more excited about the chance to share with each other and pray for each other.

Our other weekly ministries are going very well. My Sunday School class is beginning to get used to what we are doing, so they are beginning to open up and participate more in the discussions. We are starting to see a larger group of junior high students on Monday nights as our students are beginning to invite more and more of their friends. The students seem to be taking an interest more and more in the lessons as we work our way through the story of the

Bible from beginning to end. I am sometimes surprised at how much of the details they remember from one week to the next. Our group of senior high students who meet for Bible study every Wednesday night has taken the study of 1 Peter pretty seriously. Last year, we would often have to start late and our study was usually just a little over half an hour. This year, they show up on time and participate in the lesson for an entire hour most weeks. The best part for me is that as we discuss the passage I can tell from the discussions that these students are working through how to take these lessons and put them into practice in their lives at school, at home, and wherever else they go during the week. Please pray for all of these students that they would figure out how important these lessons are not only to learn but to apply to their lives from day to day.
