### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

### Come Early

"Do your utmost to come before winter." 2 Timothy 4:21a NKJV

It's fall and in many ways this is more the beginning of a new year than the change of calendar years in January. A new school year has begun, and with it many church, sports and other activities are off to a fresh start. With that in mind, it might be a good time now to embark on a sort of New Year's resolution and here's a good one - give yourself some margin; that is, a little extra time to be early and to allow for things to run late. In a world where many are running late and running themselves ragged, you can make a good impression on others, give yourself some peace of mind, and probably get a better parking space by just being a little early. Someone said to me once, "If you're not five minutes early, you're ten minutes late." Over time that bit of advice has proved right. Too often I have run myself too close to the minute in my scheduling and in doing so found myself in a cycle of running late. Running late has many costs. Not only is being late disrespectful to those who wait upon us, but it causes ourselves unnecessary stress, grumpiness with

traffic and trains, and impatience with those we love. The solution is simple though; just leave between five and fifteen minutes sooner than you need to reach your destination. Come what may, you will be at your best, those you love will be at ease and those with whom you meet will be pleased on your arrival. As the Apostle Paul penned his last letter to his young friend Timothy, he knew his own life's end was near and he wanted to see Timothy once more before passing from this world. Knowing in his day that once winter closed in and travel became impossible until spring, he implored Timothy, whom he wanted to see once more, to come soon, before the roads and seas were closed to him. Whether Timothy heeded Paul's urgent plea to come quickly or tarried too long, history does not record, but it was a choice the results of which Timothy would recall to dving day. Not many of our his appointments are so urgent, so life and death as Paul's request to see his friend once more, but if we treated them as such, we would enjoy life more and find that success to our endeavors came easier. I don't know what you have on your calendar for this fall but one word I leave with you, "Come early," and God's grace and peace be yours.

Among the 70 million Chinese living worldwide, there are approx. 2 million believers. And they have sent out 2,000 missionaries!
