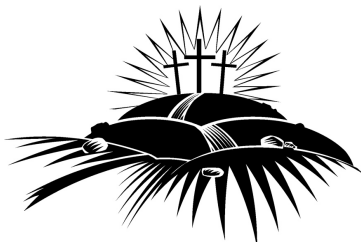

**Digging Deeper**

“Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.”
2 Timothy 2:15 KJV

Have you ever wanted to learn a Biblical language? For most people that's a very foreign thought, but for others it might be a dream come true and the opportunity of a lifetime. A friend recently asked me if I would teach a beginners class in Biblical Hebrew. After a little thought I said, "Sure." It will help me hone my skills and perhaps open a door for others to be able to read and study the Biblical text in its original language which is always an exciting thought to me. This is God's Word as it actually came to us in Moses' own words, in David's own words, in the words originally inspired by the Holy Spirit.

I have taught Hebrew before, a long time ago, and now I would like to invite you. If you want to join us we'll start meeting on Tuesday's beginning March 17th – May 19th over the noon hour (bring a sack lunch).

You may ask yourself, "What could possibly be the value of learning a foreign language that no one speaks anymore?"

Here is some food for thought:

1. The Holy Spirit is still speaking in the Hebrew language, it's the language of the Old Testament and it is beautiful.
2. In Israel they do speak it! It's the only language in history to go out of spoken use for almost 2,000 years and then be revived and spoken again by an entire nation!

In 10 weeks you will have a good beginning in the language, and be ready to begin guided reading in the Old Testament Book of Ruth. You will also be able to make good use of the many study tools available today that incorporate Biblical Hebrew.

For those who join us, I believe this will be a fun start on a path that if pursued, in class or on your own, will help you better understand where the various English translations meet at their source and could lead you to the joy of reading the Old Testament in Hebrew on your own. The book we'll be using is *The First Hebrew Primer, Third Edition* and its *Answer Book* for easy self checking of your work along the way. This is by far the gentlest and most enjoyable introduction to a Biblical language I have found. The cost of the two books is \$36.04 plus shipping and you can purchase them yourself at Amazon.com or I will be happy to get them for you. If you're interested, please contact the church office by Sunday, March 8th so we can get your books ordered. Even if learning a language of the Bible is not something for you at this time, let me encourage you to be diligent in regularly opening the Word in our language and asking the Holy Spirit to speak God's precious truth to your heart.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

We have been working on our spring Sunday School schedule - here are some important upcoming dates for you to mark on your calendars: **April 11th - Sunday School Easter Egg Hunt** and **June 15th - 19th Vacation Bible School!** Parents, I encourage you to ask and discuss with your child or children their Sunday School lesson each week. They need to know you care about what they are learning.
