From the pastor's desk . . .



**"Set Your Mind On Things
Above, Not On Earthly Things"
Colossians 3:2 NIV**

*"Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable - if anything is excellent or praiseworthy - think about such things."
Philippians 4:8 NIV*

What are you thinking about - right now, at this moment? Are you worrying or fretting? Are you grumbling in your spirit about something? Are you fearful or frustrated? Are you joyful and thankful? Are you hopeful and glad? Are you peaceful and contented? So much of our mindset depends on what we dwell on in the private world of our thoughts. What we set our minds on shapes our attitude and outlook, how we interact with others, how we get along in life, and how joyful we truly are or aren't through the day. Wisely, Paul writes to us in Colossians 3:1, **"Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God."** NIV

But how do we do that? Let's face it - many of us dwell on some very negative things

which are of no help to us at all.

1. Take every thought captive. 2 Corinthians 10:5 says,

"We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ." NIV In other words, don't let your mind just drift from one thing to another - but bring your thoughts under obedience to Christ and fix your thoughts on healthy things such as are mentioned in Philippians 4:8 above.

2. Guard your lips. Colossians 3:8 says, **"But now you must rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips."** NIV So much of our attitude and thought life is shaped by the words we ourselves say. This is one reason why it is always important to speak respectfully of your spouse - both to honor them before others and in your own heart. Tell enough demeaning jokes about your husband or wife and you will treat them in kind.

3. Guard your ears and eyes. Psalm 119:37





