

A NOTE FROM OUR BOARD PRESIDENT:

On Sunday, July 20, I announced to the Church congregation that the ministry Center note had been paid in full. Through the anonymous generous direct gift in excess of \$15,000, the note was stamped "Paid in Full". I was extremely surprised and thankful for the final payment so generously given that canceled this debt. I also recognize that it has been accomplished through the faithful regular giving of many people over the past several years. Our church has enjoyed numerous benefits by having this wonderful facility and God has touched many lives because of it. May it continue to serve as a ministry of the people of Zion Evangelical Church.

Although we have made our final payment to the money lender on the ministry center addition, we are still very much in need of your continued financial support. As areas of the Ministry Center begin to age, we will encounter additional maintenance which is generally not experienced in the first years. Items such as carpeting, heating and air conditioning as well as several other building items will eventually need to be repaired or replaced. It is vital that we establish and grow a capital improvement fund to be available at our time of need for all areas of our church. A healthy fund which is designated for capital improvements will eliminate the need for special request "surprise letters" asking for money.


